The Pacific Discovery educational travel experience offered on our semester and summer programs is unique. The group dynamics are challenging and powerful. The personal and skill development opportunities are endless. It is both exciting and immensely rewarding to participate in, and facilitate this. Recognizing the unique learning and growth opportunities, we offer interested participants the chance to further develop their own skills, and gain valuable work experience through an internship.

It is important to note, that interns are full fee paying participants, and that this role is not an offer of future employment. There is no financial remuneration. Students may be able to obtain credit for this internship through their own professors at their home school, or combine it with SCCC credit available on our programs. If you are interested in earning internship credit, we recommend you discuss this with your academic advisor prior to submitting your application or registration.

Our Expectations

Previous travel experience or group leadership is not a prerequisite, but advantageous. We expect interns to be motivated, and to display maturity and sensitivity in their interactions with other participants, and local people we spend time with.

What You Can Expect

Your program leader will put effort and time into facilitating the development of your personal skills and experience in a number of areas (varies by internship focus). You can expect to learn about and gain experience in:

- Program planning
- Logistics
- Communications
- Cross-cultural communication
- Group facilitation
- Conflict resolution
- Participant mentoring

Your program leader is on-hand 24/7 for the duration of the program, to provide guidance and mentoring. Additionally, a mid-trip and final evaluation is undertaken to ensure both your and the leader's expectations are being met. At the conclusion of the program, Pacific Discovery will provide you with a letter of completion/ reference, outlining the internship you have undertaken, and your performance in this role.
